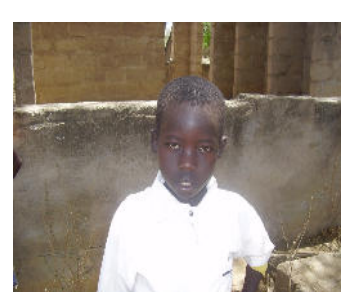

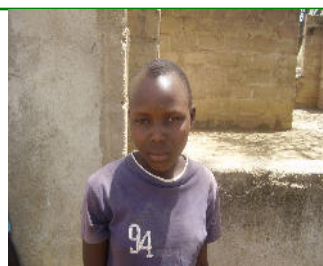

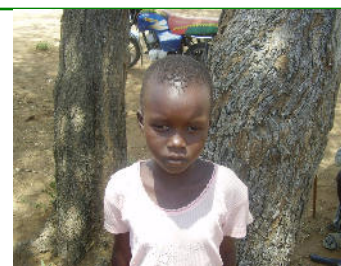

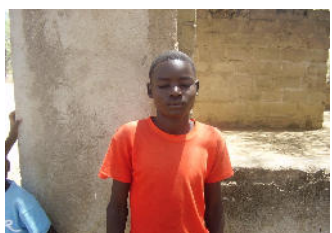

Such initiatives will help in the achievement of our vision and goals in Pokot. Education is the key to unlocking the potential of the children in Pokot. These children will work hard to bring development in their own community when they grow up and will spearhead change. WMK is also currently supporting the following children. Isaak Kosgei (Nyangaita Primary school), Mercy Chepkemei (Kamanau primary school), Cherop Loitangoria (Kamanau Primary school) and Esther Liman (Kapenguria).

Drought and Famine in Pokot

No region in Kenya faces the devastation of drought as Turkana and Pokot. Averagely, during the dry seasons, temperatures in Pokot and subsequent areas have risen to a high of 40 degrees Celsius. During such times, the people and animals suffer a lot. As a result, the Pokots who live in the affected areas are forced to move to other regions forcing children to drop out of school. Many children and animals die as a result of food shortages. This year, drought and famine has already claimed the lives of many according to the Nation newspaper of 03/02/2014. During such periods, the government is often forced to postpone the opening of schools in Pokot to attend to the crisis. Currently, over 200,000 Pokots are facing starvation and hunger. Some Pastoral communities in Pokot have reportedly migrated to the neighboring Uganda. As a result many schools sent their children home in the months of January and February. In certain areas people were forced to eat toxic wild fruits which have to be boiled for hours to make them safely edible.

Thanks to WM USA, we were able to support the children at Moi masol Academy and Nyangaita. Our Sunday porridge programme also help feed at least 120 children. WMK also sent bags of maize to the people of Kakleshon and Nyangaita. Currently, affected areas include Takaywa, Nauyapong, Alale, Nyangaita, Ombolion, Kodich and Kamanau. To contain the crisis in our area of operation in future, more support will be needed to support many families. WMK will continue to work with it's partners and other stakeholders to help feed over 2000 children in schools in different regions of Pokot. We also thank AIC Makutano, kapenguria who last month donated food: two bags of Maize, one bag of beans, one bag of porridge flour, cooking oil, sugar and vegetables. Moi Masol academy received the food on behalf of the children. We thank God for everything. Thank you AIC Makutano for your kind donation.
